Coming March 2024: Nevada ECHO for IECMH. ECHO [Extension for Community Health Outcomes] is a virtual learning community for IECMH professionals. ECHO trainings support the implementation of best practices in the field and all training sessions are tied to Endorsement® competencies. Reflective Practice Collaborative

This learning collaborative includes 6 monthly learning blocks, followed by 6 Reflective Consultation calls. Participants will receive support on RSC techniques and expand their reflective supervision skills. 




