IECMH COMPETENCIES

The Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health (IECMH) competency guidelines outline the essential skills and knowledge professionals use to promote the social, emotional, and relational well-being of infants, toddlers, young children, and their families. This month, we will explore **Reflective Practice** as an IECMH competency in action.

Reflective Practice is more than a tool—it's a **way of being** that empowers professionals to better understand themselves and those they serve. By regularly engaging in reflection, we develop a greater capacity to recognize how our feelings, thoughts, and intentions, as well as those of others, influence our actions and behaviors. This deepened self-awareness enhances the quality of our work, leading to more thoughtful and compassionate interactions with infants, young children, and families.

When professionals and agencies integrate Reflective Practice into daily routines and organizational culture, the benefits are far-reaching. From direct providers to supervisors and consultants, Reflective Practice fosters greater **emotional insight**, **stronger relationships**, and more effective services for young children and families.

Reflective Practice also creates space for professionals to examine their positions of privilege, power, and **implicit biases**, as well as the impact these have on decision-making and interactions with families from diverse backgrounds. By reflecting on these issues, we are better equipped to challenge discriminatory practices and foster equity in our work.

The Endorsement categories are defined by the way you work with or on behalf of the IECMH population. Most categories include professionals from a variety of work settings, and each scope of practice consists of people newer to the field, people who have a lifetime of experience, and people who are leaders in the field.


